## Parking around school

We have had some complaints of dangerous parking around the school around school drop off and pick up times. Although cars are prevented from driving to the gates by the school streets scheme, lots of people are parking very close to school and often leaving their cars on corners, blocking exits or parking cars outside of the designated spaces. This makes it very difficult and can be dangerous for wheelchair users or people with pushchairs. There are also lots of small children walking around who could be seriously injured if they cannot cross the road safely! Please try to park considerately if you need to park close to the school. Alternatively, if you are able to, please park a few roads further away from the school and walk to the gates to help us to keep our school community and neighbours safe!

## Fire engine visit

The Nursery children had a very exciting visit today from the team at Ealing Fire station. They brought their fire engine for the children to see and they could ask lots of interesting questions. The children loved seeing the fire fighters using the hose and they also got to try on the fire helmets and pretend to be fire fighters.
