18th July – last day of school for the Summer term, school finishes for the children at 1:30pm

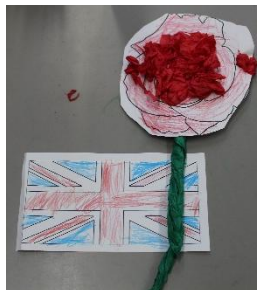
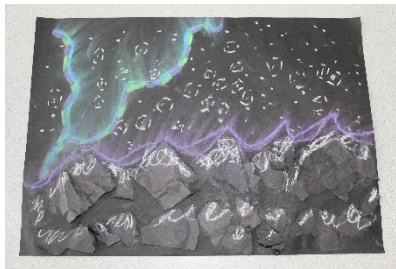
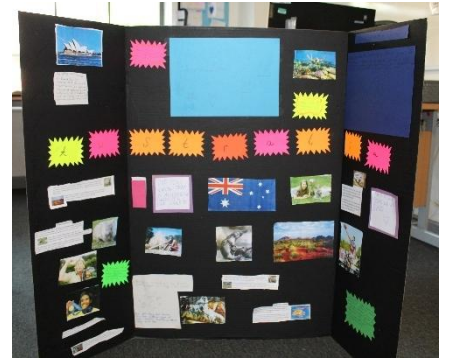
Young readers trip
