## SENDCo clinic

Miss Stack, our Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENDCo), is going to be running a SENDCo clinic weekly. # Our week at Drayton Green

This is what we have been learning about this week in each year group.

## Nursery

This week we learnt about heroes and made our own superhero pictures. We also talked about kindness and shared ways we have been kind to our friends, such as helping others, sharing, and using kind words.

In maths, we focused on the number 7 through counting and number activities.

## Reception

### Maths

In maths, this week, children have been learning to select shapes for a purpose and to recognise 2D shapes in different orientations.

### English

This week in English, our new book is Little Red Riding Hood- children explored the setting and story characters and wrote sentences about them.

### Understanding of the World:

This term, our topic in *Understanding of the World* is **"Stories from the Past."** This week, the children have been learning about fairy tales and traditional stories that have been shared for many years.

## Year 1

### Maths

In maths, this week, we have been learning how to describe position and we have been practising counting to 100.

### English

In English, this week, we read a new book, 'The Missing Chick' and practised orally retelling the story.

### Other Subjects:

#### History

This week, we have been learning about the Bill of Rights.

#### Science

This week, we have been learning about different materials.

## Year 2

### Maths

In maths, this week, we have been learning about telling the time to o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Use the paper clocks to test yourself at home.

### English

In English, this week, we have introduced our new text 'Lila and the Secret of Rain. We are learning the text and remembering the beginning, middle and end.

### Other Subjects:

#### Science

This week, we have been learning about the solar system and the order of the planets from the sun.

#### Art

This week, we have been learning about murals and we designed our own ocean mural.

## Year 4

### Maths

In maths, this week, we have been learning to partition decimal numbers by two places and to compare two decimal numbers to see which one is greater.

### English

In English, this week, we have been learning to create a character for the story The Happy Prince and to plan and retell the story as a fairy tale.

### Other Subjects:

#### Geography

This week, we have been learning about the South East of England covering the areas of Brighton and Dover

#### Science

This week, we have been learning about the water cycle and solids, liquids and gases.

Well done to Year 4 who all completed their Times Tables Check this week!

## Year 6

### Maths

In maths, this week, we have been consolidating our understanding of pie charts and percentages.

### English

In English, this week, we completed our non-chronological report for the fictional yellow-spotted lizard

### Other Subjects:

#### PSHE

This week, we looked at the choices that adults have to make.

#### Production

This week, we looked at our production scripts and learnt some more of our songs.

## SRP

### Maths

In maths this week,

#### Group one

We are identifying groups with more and fewer.

#### Group two

We are adding two-digit numbers without regrouping.

### English

In English, this week, our book is 'Ernie's seaside adventure'

We have explored the environment with a sensory story. We continue to use colourful semantics to support our sentence structure.

#### Phonics

Phoneme of the week is 'ow'

We are blending CVC words which include our phoneme of the week.

#### Handwriting

We are focusing on lower case letter formation. Using finger spaces in our writing and staying on the line.

### Other Subjects:

#### Art

We created mixed media sea side pictures. We used colouring pencils, paint and sand.

We had a trip to the farm 😊

We got to feed the animals and play on a bouncy castle. We got to stroke many animals and hold some exotic animals too.
